

The **Practical Method for Beginners on the Pianoforte**, Op. 599, is the perennial favorite set of Czerny etudes among piano teachers and students throughout the world. Comprised of one-hundred short studies, it begins at the elementary level and progresses systematically to intermediate etudes. It introduces students to a wide range of technical skills, such as scales, chords, arpeggios, and trills, as well as different touches and articulations. Czerny included a variety of tempos, from faster etudes for developing velocity, to slower etudes for the development of expressive melodic playing. These etudes will comprehensively prepare students with a secure technique needed to play all types of piano music confidently and successfully.

In this edition, the first section, “First Lessons in Learning the Notes,” has been updated for the modern teacher:

1. **Treble and Bass staff.** In the original edition, etudes 1 through 31 use only treble staves for both the left and right hands. This was the traditional 19th century method for teaching beginners. However, in the 21st century, it is now traditional to introduce both the treble and bass clef signs when teaching students to read music, with the left hand generally playing in bass staff. In this edition, etudes 1 through 31 have the left hand placed one octave lower and in the bass staff. Many of these etudes, and others in this collection, also have the right moved down one octave for greater comfort in playing and a more resonant sound.

2. **Quarter Notes and Half Notes.** In the original edition, etudes 1 through 4, and number 8, use half notes and whole notes only. This was a 19th century tradition for introducing basic note values and rhythms. In the 21st century, we have now become accustomed to starting with quarter notes and half notes, because it is easier for students to quickly see the difference between the black note-head of a quarter note in contrast to the “clear” note-head of the half note. In this edition, etudes 1 through 4, and number 8, have replaced half notes with quarter notes, and whole notes with half notes.
