- Placing pitches on a staff

- Describing the form of melodies
- Connecting written music to playing string instruments

In pages 22-48, we visit five periods of music history to see how these rules were used—*and more!*

In each period our study includes:

- Discovering the beginning of string instruments and bows in the 1500s
- Recognizing new instruments
- Describing common characteristics of the music
- Meeting some of the most well-known composers of orchestra music
- Evaluating musical performances
- Making connections to other people and events
