The Arranger

Deborah Baker Monday teaches in the award-winning orchestra program of the Logan City School District in Logan, Utah. She works with first and second year string students in the elementary schools. She is also an active bass performer and private teacher. Bass and cello are her principal instruments.

Ms. Monday received a B.M.E. with emphasis in strings from Florida State University, a M.M. in composition from the University of Alabama, and is currently pursuing a D.M.A. in composition from Louisiana State University. She has taught strings grades 6-12 in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, grades 4-12 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and grades 4-7 in Logan, Utah. In 1999, Ms. Monday was named the Utah ASTA with NSOA Elementary Teacher of the Year.

Irish Folk Music

Irish folk music is rich in tradition, highly creative, and can be quite energetic. Irish folk music was not written down, but was composed on an instrument and taught by ear. Because of this, the capabilities of the instruments used influenced the styles and construction of traditional Irish music. The most common instruments used in creating the sound of Irish music include the fiddle, Irish harp, and uilleann pipes. Uilleann pipes sound somewhat similar to Scottish bagpipes, but the design is different. The harp has become the national emblem of Ireland. The Irish harp is smaller than the modern concert harp played in orchestras. Irish harps typically have 24-34 strings.

Playing the fiddle the Irish way includes resting the instrument on the shoulder rather than under the chin. Music is usually confined to notes found in 1st position so the fiddler has a small range of notes to experiment with, but the left hand is freer to move around the available notes.

In Irish folk music, melodies are made up with only a few notes of the available scale, continually returning to them during the tune. A particular tune or pattern is picked out and then repeated time and time again with variations on that pattern. Creating new variations over and over again is a special skill of Irish folk musicians. Many people still enjoy going to a “ceilidhe” (KAY-lee). At these musical gatherings, stories are told and traditional Irish dances such as the jig and reel are performed.

The Composition

Irish folk music is divided into two main categories: 1) song music, 2) dance music. Most Irish folk music can be tracked back to the 1600s, but most of the music recorded by manuscript or played today originated in the 18th and 19th centuries. The three pieces in *For the Star of County Down* come from this general time period. They are *Gravelwalk*, *The Star of County Down*, and *The Rakes of Kildare*.
